



"Well, David, I'm 66. I'm six times older than you are; and if I had to go back and be eleven over again, I don't think I could stand it. Youth is a little trying on older folks."

David smiled, "That's okay, Doc, you're not fooling me. I know I'm not going to get well. But I wouldn't trade places with you, either."

That surprised me, "Why not?"

"Doc, I've brought eleven souls to Jesus---one for every year."

"Tell me about it, David."

"I was the first one in our house to become a Christian. Then I got my mother, brother, dad, sister and some of the kids in the neighborhood. Well, when I came to the hospital, I had won ten souls for Jesus. So I said, "Lord, you know I probably won't get out of this place. I'd like to get one more soul so that I'll have one person for each year I've lived."

"Well, Doc, I prayed about it and I talked to everyone I say; and just last night, the night nurse told me she has accepted Christ. So that makes eleven. That's why I wouldn't trade places with you."

I would say to myself, "What if I give my life to Jesus and then I find out that Christianity is not true, or maybe there is not a god, or maybe the Buddhists are right in what they believe." I studied my Bible and I prayed about my doubts. One night in my bedroom, I prayed and told Jesus that I was sorry for my sins. I asked Him to come and live in my life and be my lord. "But please, Jesus, let's just not make this public. I will belong to You, but I do not want to go forward in church. All those people would stare at me."
