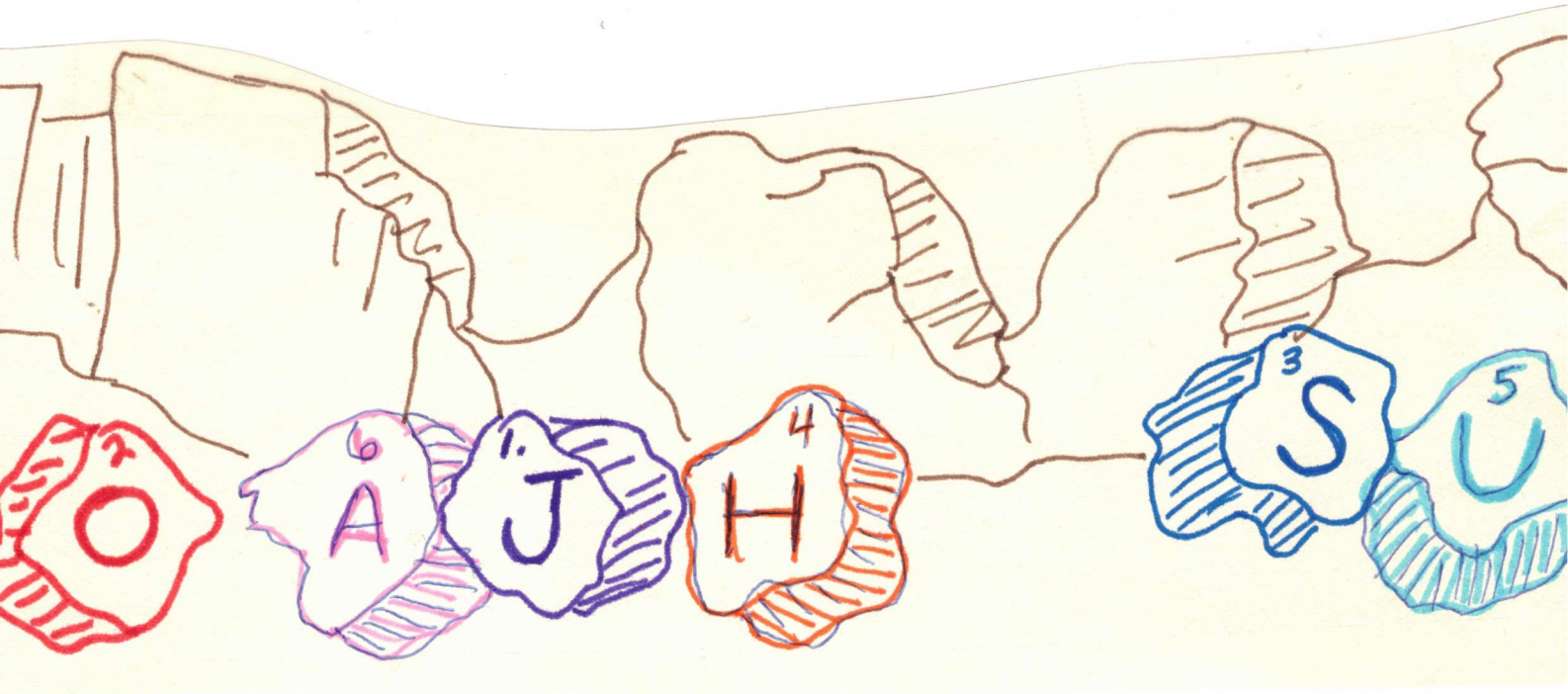


Preschool and Kindergarteners: The walls of Jericho fell down. Copy the letters on the rocks in the boxes below in the right order and you will find out who led God's people.

5th-6th Graders: Jericho was not a huge city, but it sat high up on a mound. The walls of Jericho were so thick that people (like Rahab) built their homes in the walls. The people of Jericho expected the Israelites to attack. They waited and waited for the attack to come. It caught them off guard when it finally came because all God's people had done all week was march around the city silently.

God's plan involved silence. How long can you be quiet? Write down all the noises you hear around you right now. (At my house I hear the clock ticking, the furnace blowing, my husband dressing, the fan turning and my fingers typing.) What are you hearing?

Now what if I asked you to go somewhere completely quiet. Where could you go?

When I was your age, we had a small house with lots of kids and the only place I could go to find silence was the bathtub. I would let the water drip just a little as I sat in silence so the drip drip drip would cover up the noises outside the bathroom door. When everything was silent except the drip, drip, drip, I would pray. As I talked to God that way, in that very quiet place, I would hear Him speak back to me. Most of the time it was a new way of thinking of the problem or an idea of what He wanted me to do.

5th-6th Graders: Each day we are in battles.
